EVALUATION PROFILE

2022/23

OVERVIEW:

This course is designed for North Toronto students who have completed a grade ten Strings course or have equivalent experience and are at an advanced level on their instrument. The program will focus on individual and ensemble performance and provide a grounding knowledge of music theory, history, analysis and composition.

COURSE: GRADE ELEVEN STRINGS COURSE CODE: AMO 3MP

CONTENT:

Performance: Areas covered will include technique (e.g., bowing, posture, tone production, intonation, articulation), musicianship, solo and ensemble performance.

Theory/Composition: Identification and use of melodic and rhythmic notation and musical terms. Compositional assignments will include arranging and melodic composition.

History/Listening/Analysis: Explore Western music from the Medieval to the Baroque Period. In-class listening will include both recorded and live performances. Emphasis will be on analysis of different musical elements and the study of rhythmic, interval and melodic dictation.

TYPES OF EVALUATION:

Students will discuss and confirm evaluation criteria at the beginning of the year. Students are evaluated individually in relation to their own rate of progress within a class expectation.

Performance technique tests: Regular daily assessment as well as individual tests and quizzes will be held to examine progress in posture, tone production, intonation, articulation, musicianship and reading skills.

Written submissions: Written assignments will occur in the form of compositions, history assignments, theory quizzes, theory homework, listening quizzes, and concert reviews. Written evaluations of personal achievement will be handed in after each performance test. Completion of practice logs must occur on a continual basis.
