Course Description

OVERVIEW:

This is an open level course designed for North Toronto students who are experienced singers together with those who have had no previous musical experience in singing. The program will focus on individual and ensemble performance and provide a grounding knowledge of music theory, history, analysis and creation.

Performance: Areas covered will include technique (e.g. posture, tone production, intonation, articulation), sight-singing, musicianship, ensembles and solo performance.

Theory/Sight-Singing /Ear Training: Identification and use of melodic and rhythmic notation and musical terms. Introduction to and application of solfege through written work and sight-singing. Ear training includes interval recognition and musical dictation.

History/Listening/Analysis: Explore the evolution of Western music from the Medieval Period to Modern Day. In-class listening will include both recorded and live performances. Emphasis will be on analysis of different musical elements.

Assessment and Evaluation

TYPES OF EVALUATION:

Students will discuss and confirm evaluation criteria at the beginning of the year. Students are evaluated individually in relation to their own rate of progress within a class expectation.

Performance technique tests: Regular daily assessment as well as individual tests and quizzes will be held to examine progress in posture, tone production, intonation, articulation, musicianship and reading skills.

Written submissions: Written assignments will occur in the form of personal and analytical reflections, foundations tests and assignments. Written evaluations and reflections of personal achievement will be submitted.
