# Choose Wisely!

- Course offerings based on your choices NOW.
- No changes in course selection until **August/September** (when wait times are long and many courses full \*\* remember the long lines \*\*)
- Space is always limited, so make good and educated decisions **now**.
- Your choices will affect your **college/ university applications** – work backwards from program prerequisites.

# Prerequisites

- You must **HAVE** or be **CURRENTLY TAKING** the prerequisite for any course you choose on **myBlueprint Course Selection**.
- If you plan to have the prerequisite completed by June 30th 2023, you may select that course.
- If you plan to take a prerequisite in the summer, you can only request the course in course change days in Aug/Sept.

# Keep in mind...

- **Private school** credits are marked as such on your transcript.
- Students who become **part-time** are not eligible for Commencement awards and may not be able to participate in clubs, sports and teams at NT.
- Students who take **compulsory** credits outside of NT are not eligible for Commencement awards.
- NT teachers work collaboratively so that you are **ready** for the next year's course requirements.

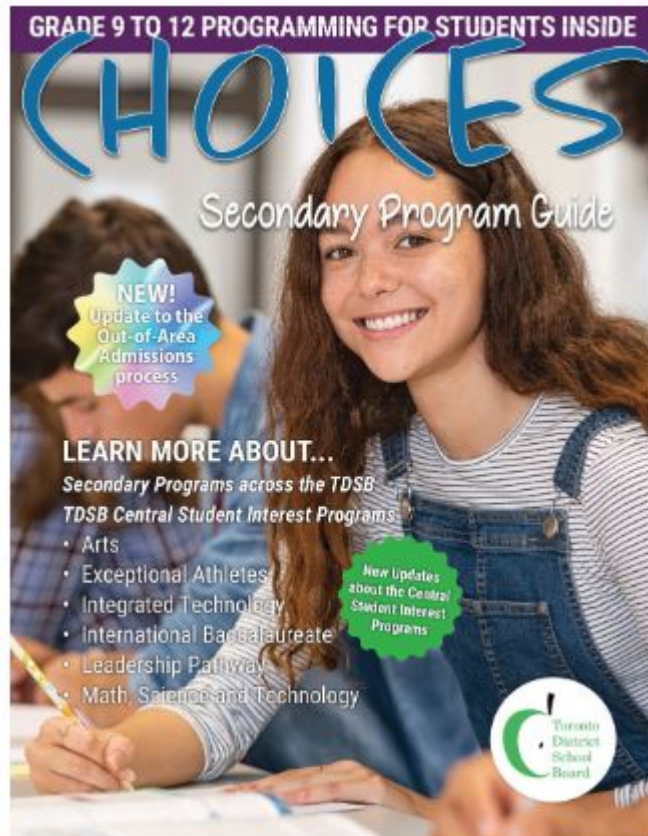
# Gr. 11 Course Load

- Minimum of 7 (if you have 16 or more credits).
- We recommend taking 8 to start the year so you have a cushion.
- myBlueprint will allow 7 courses so check that you have enough credits for a spare!
- **Full Disclosure:** all Gr. 11 & 12 final course marks, withdrawals, & repeats are recorded on transcripts.

# Gr. 12 Course Load

- **Minimum of 6** (if you have 24 or more credits).
- We recommend taking 7 or 8 so you have a cushion.
- myBlueprint will allow 6 courses so **check that you have enough credits to graduate!**

- 1 Technological Education Credit (Grade 9 or 10)
- 0.5 Career Studies
- 0.5 Civics

**Students must also complete:**

- 13 optional credits (may include up to 4 credits earned through approved dual credit programs)
- 40 hours of community service
- Provincial Literacy Requirement

(Option to opt out available. See Guidance for Exemption Form)

Plus one credit from the STEM related course group:
