# Choose Wisely!

- Course offerings based on your choices NOW.
- No changes in course selection until August/September (when wait times are long and many courses full \*\* remember the long lines \*\*)
- Space is always limited, so make good and educated decisions <u>now</u>.
- Your choices will affect your college/ university applications – work backwards from program prerequisites.

### Prerequisites

- You must HAVE or be CURRENTLY TAKING the prerequisite for any course you choose on myBlueprint Course Selection.
- If you plan to have the prerequisite completed by June 30th 2023, you may select that course.
- If you plan to take a prerequisite in the summer, you can only request the course in course change days in <u>Aug/Sept</u>.

# Keep in mind...

- Private school credits are marked as such on your transcript.
- Students who become part-time are not eligible for Commencement awards and may not be able to participate in clubs, sports and teams at NT.
- Students who take compulsory credits outside of NT are not eligible for Commencement awards.
- NT teachers work collaboratively so that you are ready for the next year's course requirements.


# Gr. 11 Course Load

- myBlueprint will allow 7 courses so check that you have enough credits for a spare!
- Full Disclosure: all Gr. 11 & 12 final course marks, withdrawals, & repeats are recorded on transcripts.

# Gr. 12 Course Load

- Minimum of 6 (if you have 24 or more credits).
- We recommend taking 7 or 8 so you have a cushion.
- myBlueprint will allow 6 courses so check that you have enough credits to graduate!
